## **Challenging God with Foolish Questions**

## Malachi 1-3

## Introduction:

- 1. Sad when a child who has been given a better life than their parents become ungrateful. Birthday and Christmas gifts, "Is that all?"
- 2. There may be times when we behave the same way with our heavenly Father.
- 3. O.T. shares with us a conversation God had with His children and they, because of ingratitude, asked God a series of foolish questions.
- I. "How have You loved us?" Malachi 1:2
  - A. God chose them to be His children.
    - 1. Under Persian rule. Their agriculture suffered, they knew they were slaves in a foreign land and asked, "How have You loved us, if we are suffering?"
    - 2. Their ruin was due to their unfaithfulness and disobedience. God demonstrated His love in that He still called them His children, blessed them, and had a plan to return them to Jerusalem.
    - 3. Malachi 1:2-5 Reminded that Esau deserved the firstborn blessings, yet He chose Jacob the younger.
  - B. John 3:16; 15:13 -ls this not the message of the cross?
    - 1. What should our attitude be towards God in light of the sacrifice on Calvary?
    - 2. Sadly, the majority of mankind does not appreciate God and His love to the extent of obeying Him.
- II. "How have we despised Your name? Malachi 1:6
  - A. In that they offered blind, lame and sick sacrifices to God (7-10; 13-14; Lev. 21:8, 21; Deut. 15:21)
  - B. Are we guilty of giving God that which costs us little? Have we offered the sick, lame, and blind? (Rom. 12:1-2)
- III. "How have we wearied You? Malachi 2:17
  - A. They went as far as blaming God for the ills and suffering. They accused God of breaking His covenant. (Hebrews 6:18)
  - B. Reality is that many accuse God for their misfortune. "Why me, Lord?" (Job 2:10, "shall we accept good and not adversity?")
- IV. "How have we robbed You?" Malachi 3:8-9

- A. Note that at first the accusation is towards the individual, then as a nation.
- B. They were not paying their tithes as they could, those that did it, payed with the wrong attitude.
- C. Same can be true in the N.T., under the law of grace and liberty. (1 Cor. 16). It all has to do with attitude.
- D. Have you robbed God?
- V. "What have we spoken against You?" Malachi 3:13-15
  - A. The complained that it was useless to serve God faithfully. They complained amongst themselves, and in public.
  - B. They ignored all the good God had done for them. They ignored that God could have destroyed then as in the flood or Sodom and Gomorrah.
  - C. Have we failed to recognize God's goodness?

## Conclusion:

- 1. People needed a lesson on humility, gratefulness and repentance.
